About the College

Women's College, Samastipur was established in 1956 by **Late Badri Narayan Singh**. It is a leading government college which was initially setup as a girl's tutorial college and imparted education up to the graduation level. The mission of the institution was to ensure that the privilege of education reached the young women, especially those from the weaker section of the society. It was latter converted into Women's College Samastipur and was accorded its first affiliation in 1964 by the Bihar University, Muzaffarpur up to degree standard. The college became a constituent unit under Lalit Narayan Mithila University, Kameshwar Nagar, Darbhanga in 1980. At present the college offers honors courses in the faculties of science, social science and humanities. It is the only centre for women's higher education in the district and the oldest one in the north Bihar. It got affiliation under UGC act 2f in the year 1977.

About the Department of Economics

The Department of Economics is a major and premiere department of Women's College (one of the most largest and prestigious College not only in L.N.Mithila University, Darbhanga, but also in Bihar). It has a glorious past, grand present and hopefully and enchanting future since the 1956, the year of establishment of Women's College, Samastipur.

The Economics Department of Women's College, Samastipur takes pride in being among the best Departments for the study of Economics at the undergraduate level. It comprises a young and dynamic faculty member.

The teaching methodology combines standard methods of University education – lectures and tutorials – with written assignments, project work, field trips, and student presentations both in class and in seminars. Students are also encouraged to participate in corporate and research life of institutions outside college through internships.

The department has an active and vibrant Economics Society, of which all students admitted to the honours course are members. Society organizes a variety of events to promote students' interest in the subject.

Apart from the regular activities, other seminars, talks and workshops are also held spread over the year.

About the Webinar

The present state of Bihar, comprising about 3 per cent of the total geographical area of India and about 9 per cent of its total population (102 million as per the 2011 Census), is the most densely populated state of the country. Of the total population of Bihar state, around 88.71 percent live in the villages of rural areas. Till recently, it was also among the slowest growing regions of the country. Although the growth rate of state's GDP has considerably accelerated during the last 10 years, with the state economy growing at over 10 per cent per annum, the state continues to be among the economically most backward ones with one of the lowest per capita incomes and highest incidence of poverty in the country.

Due to Covid-19 pandemic and the lockdown, there has been no economic activity in Bihar, and the state government has not been able to generate enough revenue from taxes. Another important aspect of Covid-19 is the problems faced by its migrant workers. It is estimated that around three million workers have gone to other states for work. The pandemic has left them stranded, without jobs or the wherewithal to return home.

Bihar is in the grip of flood once again. More than 25 lakh population of the state is affected. 64 blocks of about 10 districts of the state are submerged in water. So far 34 people have died. Despite all the claims of the government on this problem that has been going on for years, the situation is the same as every year.

What will be the impact of Covid-19 pandemic and flood the rural economy of Bihar? How to get rid of it? This Webinar will address various issues of Bihar's economy. This will be useful for policy makers, academician, Research Scholar, Students, farmer, corporate scoters etc.
